# **Royal Academy Information Sheet**

Thank you for inquiring about Royal Academy. Enclosed is the Application for Enrollment, the Educational Questionnaire and the Frequently Asked Questions sheets. We look forward to working with you in developing and carrying out your educational objectives. The following is a brief outline of the procedure to follow.

- 1. Fill out completely and return the enclosed application and educational questionnaire. Please fill out one set for each student you are enrolling.
- 2. Provide COPIES of high school transcripts, report cards, and recent testing results from previously attended school(s). If your cild has an I.E.P., please enclose a copy.
- 3. Enclose a recent photo of the student.
- 4. Include 1/2 the tuition with the application. The balance of the tuition as well as payment for books and materials is due at the enrollment meeting. Mastercard and Visa are accepted. - 5. Upon receipt of the complete application packet, we will call you to schedule the enrollment meeting. Note: Please DO NOT fax your packet or other important documents.

# **Royal Academy Frequently Asked Questions**

## Is testing required prior to enrollment?

In most cases, achievement testing is necessary to help design an appropriate curriculum. This determination will be made at the time of enrollment. Testing fees are separate from the tuition.

### What curriculum does Royal Academy use? May I use my own curriculum?

We custom-design the course work for each student, recognizing interests, achievement levels, and future plans as well as parental goals. At the time of enrollment, the parent and student either travel to the school or set up a telephone conference to discuss the program for the year.

Some parents will continue using their present texts and materials. They need help tailoring and enhancing the educational program. Other parents need guidance in knowing what materials to use, based upon their child's learning style and abilities.

#### **How do I obtain texts and materials?**

Royal Academy has a lending library open to its students (a book deposit fee is required). Donations of books and materials are appreciated.

Textbooks, computer software and other educational materials are available through the Home Education & Family Services Bookstore which is located on the premises of Royal Academy. The staff is experienced in assisting parents, helping them locate appropriate materials. If necessary, items can be special ordered.

## What type of support will I receive?

Each family is assigned a supervisory teacher to assist with the student's educational plan. This teacher reviews your student's progress and program four times during the school year and is available by phone to answer your questions. Continuity occurs because the relationship develops throughout the year with the parent, student, and teacher. This also allows the program to become more fine-tuned to the student's needs as the school year progresses. Guidance counseling for students and families is also available.

#### How do I document my student's work?

The parent completes a written report at the end of each quarter and includes representative samples of the student's work (book reports, math sheets, research papers, etc.). Students and parents who live nearby also meet quarterly with the supervisory teacher. Where distance is a factor, the parent telephones the office to set up a quarterly "phone" appointment. At the time of the appointment, the parent telephones the supervisory teacher to discuss the student's work and progress.

At the end of the school year, an annual report and a certificate of completion is mailed to the parent. This report summarizes the student's work, subject grades, and, if applicable, credits allotted.

# Is there a graduation ceremony?

Royal Academy holds a graduation ceremony for seniors in June each year. All students and family members are invited to attend. Diplomas and transcripts are mailed to those students graduating at other times during the year and they will be recognized at the June ceremony.

#### Where are Royal Academy alumni now?

Our alumni choose different paths upon graduation. The following areas show the range of pursuits our graduates follow: college, military, workforce, marriage, and family. The staff remains available to help the alumni with future plans.
